Contemporary Art/Archaeology is an interdisciplinary short-form series presenting cutting-edge works in the field of contemporary art and archaeology to a broad audience within both the academic and artistic communities. The series transcends conventional archaeological analyses of art by offering innovative perspectives on modern society, culture and heritage that result from transformative interpretations of artifacts, sites, monuments and material remains. The series publishes foundational case studies for the emergent trans-discipline of art/archaeology, as well as providing detailed, well-illustrated examples of existing work that is currently inaccessible to the public. Consequently, book projects encompass individual and practice-based creative works within the field, as well as thematic studies dedicated to influential artists and their contributions to the discipline.



Critically, these are not standard research monographs or edited anthologies; they are single- or multi-authored presentations and discussions of innovative work written in the words of the archaeologists, artists and designers who created them. As such, each manuscript typically ranges from 40,000 to 65,000 words and includes up to 70 halftone illustrations. The case studies and projects featured in Contemporary Art/Archaeology stand as the formative examples that shape a new approach to understanding the past, materiality and heritage.
